Call for Abstracts Now Open for Active Living Research 2014 Conference

Abstracts for presentations and workshops are now being accepted for the 11th Annual Active Living Research (ALR) Conference scheduled for March 9-12, 2014, in San Diego, California. The theme of the 2014 conference, "Niche to Norm," recognizes the importance of advancing active living from an emerging research field with limited results and impact to well-accepted findings that regularly guide decision-making across sectors to create more active communities.

ALR encourages abstracts related to both research and practice or policy, which highlight how to use evidence to increase physical activity in many settings.
