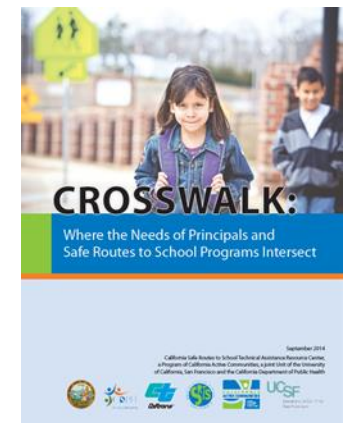

Provides an overview of why it is important to engage school district leaders, what results those relationships can achieve, and how to go about doing this work.

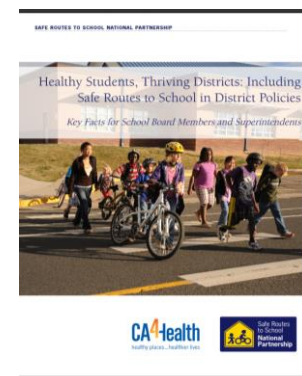
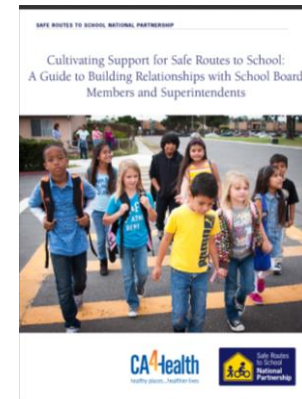
