- In 2013, we served 9 classes with just over \$7K.



- Need: Data! Gaps, Justification of Importance

## \$56.8 MILLION

Since 2017 and over 6 grants, we've helped secure \$56.8 million to complete infrastructure improvements across the county

• This includes direct assistance with composing sections of applications, providing edits and recommendations, collecting data, and providing the public health perspective




### Relationships built

- Leverage different grants, groups
- Stay involved with communities after grants end
- Support other agencies (PW) who don't have the capacity to:
  - Compile stats
  - Lead activities that help inform work (e.g., walk audits)
  - Lead community engagement

### Evolve over time

- Identify and address gaps
- Use best practices/evidence-based strategies
