The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments: SGVCOG is working on launching a regional e-bike rental to give SGV residents an opportunity to become more familiar with e-bikes and their role in zero emission mobility. Participants will be able to choose from two types of e-bicycles: a simple, all-purpose electric bicycle, and a cargo electric bicycle designed to carry larger loads and/or small children. Rentals will likely be on a monthly basis, with a potential opportunity to rent-to-own. The new program is expected to launch sometime in calendar year 2022.
