Q&A

1. Q: Has ATP funded any open streets programs? I'm assuming that falls under NI, but not sure if open streets has formally been included as something eligible for NI funding
A: Yes, open streets would be eligible for NI funding. Here is one example from Orange County – [Go Human Event: Explore Beach Boulevard!](#)
2. Q: Is there a guidance information for equipment purchases before the Cycle 8 application is released?
A: Yes. You can visit [ATP General and Technical Information](#) Caltrans page and look under the "Non-Infrastructure Information" tab for the ATP NI Guidance. This is where the updated guidance will be linked once adopted as well.
3. Q: How have you stayed involved with communities after the end of your grant?
A: One way that we stay involved is by reaching each school, perhaps not in the same way, but making some connection at some point. For example, we may be able to do a bike rodeo in one school, while another school may be provided with pedestrian lessons or resources. We try to spread the love throughout as a way to help maintain our relationships.



4. Q: Related to staying involved w/ communities, do you have data/statistics showing the extent to which programs you've launched have sustained - 2, 3 yrs + after.
A: No. Caltrans currently does not collect this type of data.
